

Internships for using the qualifications of ALs

• In-School Internships

> Interns are hired by the Accessibility Center, and work on promoting in-school accessibility, school support services, and improvement of the school environment.

• Local Internships

> Interns work on supporting learning for local children and junior high and high school students.

• Corporate Internships

> Interns receive job training in companies with an understanding of AL.

Accessibility Leader (AL) Specific Program



Accessibility Specialist

All ALP programs are curriculums designated as "AL Specific Program". Students can obtain "Accessibility Specialist" qualification of Hiroshima University if they complete all ALP programs

(1. educational curriculums, 2. 1st level AL certifications, 3. AL camps or AL internships) and get credit for "accessibility studies," a class to be held in the School of Integrated Arts and Sciences.
